

Guidelines for levels of traffic by category

Use this general guideline to help specify the appropriate types of carpet to suit traffic needs in various facility setting. When identifying the location where carpet will be specified, it is also important to define the level of traffic expected. Is it consistent over the whole area, or is it concentrated in one small area? Here are some examples to demonstrate typical levels of traffic by category:
